The Bachelor of Science in Applied Health Sciences (BSAHS) is an interdisciplinary program for students with an interest in health sciences.

Graduates will emerge with a strong foundation in:

- Medical terminology, anatomy and physiology
- Communication within a health care setting
- Interdisciplinary patient care
- Critical thinking and writing
- Ethics
- Diversity across the health science continuum

The curriculum consists of a variety of pathways to prepare students for application to a health science professional program or as a stand-alone degree to work in various health care settings.

Students are required to complete a minor as part of the degree and can choose from more than 100 Wayne State University minor programs, including health communication, health care ethics, law and social work, public health, and more.

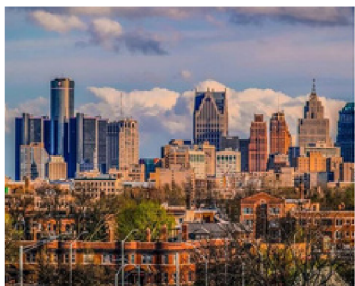
This is WSU Applebaum's only direct-admit degree program. That means students can start the program in their first year and connect with the college right away!
