WHAT DOES A FORENSIC INVESTIGATION PROFESSIONAL DO?

Forensic investigation professionals come from a variety of backgrounds and support a variety of criminal investigations by helping law-enforcement officials analyze and understand evidence. They draw on knowledge from a broad range of areas, including specimen collection and analysis, forensic anatomy, forensic pathology, criminal justice, and photographic evidence, as well as ethics and the law. This program is geared towards professionals who are seeking a supplement to their career or related degree. Forensic investigation skills can also be useful for various professionals, such as fire inspectors, emergency service personnel, nurses, and social workers whose work relates to the criminal-justice system.

WHY WAYNE STATE UNIVERSITY?

Wayne State University is one of America's premier urban research universities, with more than 33,000 graduate and undergraduate students. The University provides a multidisciplinary approach to research and education, and collaborates closely with government, industry and other institutions on a range of programs.

The Eugene Applebaum College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences (EACPHS) is located on the single largest academic medical campus in the United States and puts you in close proximity to the nation's leading health care educators. Instructors in the Forensic Investigation program are comprised of faculty from Wayne State's departments of Fundamental and Applied Sciences and Criminal Justice. Personnel from the Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb County medical examiner's offices and the Michigan State Crime Lab provide expertise to the program. The program also has an affiliation with the Department of Justice, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) of the US Treasury Department.

HOW DO I APPLY?

The application deadline is **June 1** of each year. The applicant must successfully complete the admission requirements, including application for admission to WSU and the professional program application. The program is open to graduates of accredited four-year baccalaureate programs. Completion of admission requirements does not guarantee admission into the program.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum 2.50 GPA
- Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- Letter of interest/personal statement that includes a summary of your background and interest in forensic investigation addressed to the Curriculum Coordinator
- Submission of official transcripts

CERTIFICATE COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS

- 24-26 Total Semester hours
- Completion of all coursework with a grade of "C" (2.0) or higher
- Cumulative 2.5 GPA in the certificate coursework

"In fact, I actually began working there before graduation, as an intern, and that led to my being hired full-time." Brown's

appointment entails monitoring the legal sale and transfer of firearms and explosives, and supporting criminal investigations. "I appreciate the variety of knowledge and experience covered in the Wayne State program," he says. "We covered medical and scientific fields, as well as criminal-justice subjects. The program provided a good balance of information that prepared me well."
