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WHAT DOES A NURSE ANESTHETIST DO?

A nurse anesthetist is a healthcare professional who assesses and documents the patient's physical status, as well as selecting and implementing an appropriate anesthetic plan for the patient. They administer all forms of anesthesia, including general, regional, local and IV sedation. The nurse anesthetist works in a wide variety of settings, with responsibilities that include pre-operative, intra-operative and post-operative anesthesia care. The nurse anesthetist remains with the patient throughout the surgery. They also participate in acute and chronic pain management as well as cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

The program is accredited by the Council on Accreditation (COA) of Nurse Anesthesia Educational Programs. Upon program completion, the graduate is fully prepared to complete the National Certification Examination and to practice in the clinical setting of their choice.

HOW DO I APPLY?

The application deadline is **July 1** of each year. The applicant must complete all admission requirements including the program application and supplemental materials.

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ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible to apply to the Nurse Anesthesia program, applicants must have the following:

- All Applicants must be a Registered Nurse with a baccalaureate degree.
- Six (6) credits of chemistry (lecture): inorganic/general, organic, or biochemistry taken within 10 years of application with an earned final grade of "B" or higher.
- Four (4) credits of biology: microbiology, physiology, or anatomy taken within 10 years of application with an earned final grade of "B" or higher.
- Overall GPA, nursing GPA, and science prerequisite GPA need to be a minimum of 3.0 or higher.
- Current RN licensure.
- Current Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS)
- Current Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS)
- CCRN certification by July 1.
- Current employment of a minimum of one year full-time in an Adult ICU (SICU, MICU, CICU). PACU, ER, and Pediatric employment are not accepted as ICU experience.
- Completion of one in-hospital shadow experience at the applicant's own work setting on or before July 1. Three professional references, two from current ICU RN co-workers and one from your immediate RN ICU supervisor.

ADMISSION INTO THE PROGRAM IS CONTINGENT UPON:

- Successful interview and acceptance into the program.
- Completion of the following graduate level courses after acceptance into the program is granted:
 - EER 7630 Statistics
 - EER 7640 Research
 - AN 7590 Anatomy
