EACPHS Doctor of Pharmacy Program Faculty Guidelines to Promote Academic Success Approved by CAPP: 05/26/2023

I. Purpose

- a. Provide faculty guidance for identifying students **at risk for non-success** within the Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) program
- b. Outline strategies for promoting academic success

II. At-Risk Students – Defined

- a. Students defined as **at risk for non-success** include (but are not limited to) those who experience one of more of the following:
 - i. Receive a score of < 60% on the first exam of a didactic course
 - ii. Have a score of < 70% at the midpoint of a didactic course
 - iii. Unsatisfactory midpoint assessment on IPPE or APPE rotation, defined as:
 - More than one competency scored as 1 on midpoint evaluation
 - iv. Preceptor contacts the Office of Experiential Education with concerns about a student.

III. Identification of At-Risk Students in Your Course

a. Course coordinators should identify at risk students **no later than the midpoint** of the course.

IV. Notify at risk students via email to inform them of their status.

- a. The course coordinator or experiential coordinator should send an email notification to the atrisk student which should include the following:
 - i. Strongly advised to meet and assess individual reasons for non-success in the course.
 - ii. Inform the students of **Program and University Resources to Promote Academic Success** (see V and VI below).
- b. The student's faculty advisor should be cc'd on this email.
