

TRANSFER EQUIVALENCY GUIDE FOR SPRING ARBOR UNIVERSITY

This guide is not a comprehensive list of all equivalent courses. It reflects the most current courses offered by the Spring Arbor University that will fulfill the prerequisites for the programs listed below. Older courses not listed on this chart may also fulfill the prerequisites for these programs. Please refer to Wayne State University's Transfer Credit website www.transfercredit.wayne.edu for a more comprehensive list of courses that may fulfill these prerequisites. All prerequisites and general education requirements must have a minimum grade of C/2.0. All courses must be for grade. Pass/Fail and Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory grades are not accepted. All science prerequisites must be completed within six years prior to admission into the program. Prerequisites and equivalent courses change. It is the responsibility of the student to keep current with any changes to the prerequisites and equivalent courses.

- (1) For the physical therapy program, biology course must be taken for 3 credits. Course cannot be a duplicate of course(s) that fulfill a prerequisite. Biochemistry, Kinesiology, Athletic Training or Sports Medicine are not accepted.
- (2) The physical therapy program only requires two chemistry courses with at least one lab and topics do not overlap. Options include CHM 1020 or 1220/1230, CHM 1030 or CHM 1240/1250 or CHM 2220/2230.
- (3) For the pharmacy program, you must have at least six semester credit hours of anatomy and physiology with at least three semester credit hours of anatomy of physiology at the 3000-level or higher

- (2) For the Occupational Therapy program, you need to take a social inquiry course. Look at the next page under "General Education Requirements" for information that can assist with the fulfillment of this prerequisite. P S 1010 or equivalent cannot be used to fulfill social inquiry requirement.
- (3) For the Physical Therapy program, you need to take two 3000-level or higher courses in the same discipline. For example, two 3000-level or higher courses in biology or two 3000-level or higher courses in psychology.
- (4) For the Mortuary Science program, applicants may follow the previous program-specific prerequisite requirements until Fall 2020. All students must follow the new General Education requirements as of Fall 2019. Students who enrolled at Wayne State prior to Fall 2018 can choose to follow the new general education program or the previous requirements.
