The Wayne State DNAP degree program is 87 credits taken full-time over nine semesters. Clinical experiences begin in the second semester and continue throughout the program. Graduates are eligible to take the National Certification Examination (NCE) given by the National Board of Certification and Recertification for Nurse Anesthetists (NBCRNA).

Required to apply

- Baccalaureate degree in nursing from an accredited program
- Minimum of one undergraduate course (3 credits) of Chemistry: Organic or Biochemistry taken within 10 years of application with a final grade of "B" or higher (General Chemistry courses are not accepted)
- Minimum of one undergraduate course (3 credits) of Microbiology or Anatomy & Physiology taken within 10 years of application with a final grade of "B" or higher
- Overall minimum GPA of 3.0 for the last 60 credits completed
- Overall nursing GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Overall science GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Current RN licensure
- Current Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS)
- Current Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS)
- CCRN Certification
- Current full-time employment in an ICU (SICU, MICU, CICU, Neurotrauma, Pediatric ICU in an academic teaching hospital). PACU and ER employment are not accepted as ICU experience.
- Shadowing experience at your hospital of employment or any other hospital
- Three professional references, two from current ICU co-workers and one from immediate RN ICU supervisor
- Note that your NursingCAS application must be received by June 1 and verified by July 1 to be considered for admission. We strongly recommend submitting your application as early as possible; verification can take up to 6 weeks.
