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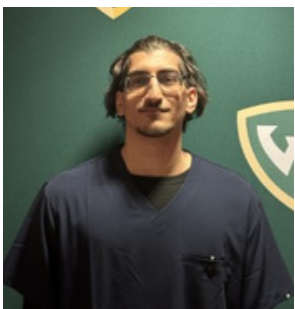
### WHAT DOES A RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGIST DO?

Radiologic technologists are healthcare professionals who administer prescribed radiation for the purpose of medical diagnosis. Registered radiologic technologists perform radiographic procedures using technologically advanced equipment to produce 2-D and 3-D images of the tissue, organs, bones and vessels of patients for evaluation by radiologists. They may also choose to specialize in a specific imaging technique such as computed tomography, mammography, magnetic resonance imaging, bone densitometry, cardiovascular-interventional radiography, quality management, or general radiography. Radiologic technologists may work in a wide variety of healthcare settings from large hospitals and imaging centers to small clinics or offices, performing radiographic exams for a broad spectrum of clinical services, or specializing in one specific area such as orthopedics, pediatrics, or gastrointestinal radiology.

### HOW DO I APPLY?

All applicants to the RT program must include the following supporting documentation to their college application. Completion of the prerequisites with the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission to the professional program. Incomplete applications will not be considered for admission. Applications open six months prior to deadline.

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## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Completion (minimum grade of "C" 2.0 where A = 4.0) of all pre-professional courses (or their equivalents) by the end of the Winter semester, prior to beginning the professional program. BIO 3200 (or equivalent) must be completed by December of the year of application.
- Minimum 2.80 overall grade point average as well as a minimum 2.70 in all science and non-science prerequisite coursework.
- Minimum of 60 credit hours
- Equivalent pre-professional coursework taken at an accredited college or university is acceptable
- Completion of the professional program application form and associated requirements and submission of official transcripts to:
